Author of Mass of Creation, We Remember, Shepherd Me, O God, All Are Welcome, Gather Us In and much more, Marty's music appears widely in numerous hymnals in Catholic and Protestant churches worldwide. This past May, National Pastoral Musician honored Marty Haugen as the 2007 Pastoral Musician of the Year "for songs of the love and faithfulness of God and of the praise, lament, and prayer of God's people."

On September 24 at 7:00 PM in the Chapel of Mary, Marty will present his original work **Turn My Heart**, a collection of prayers and psalms, songs scripture and poems, guiding us through the steps that define difficult times and into God's presence.

On September 25 at 7:00 PM in the Chapel of Mary, Marty will present **In The Days to Come**, an interfaith work centered on peacemaking. Through songs and readings, In the Days to Come sets the tone for a peace and justice among all people in a prayer service format, and includes Christian, Jewish, Islamic, and Buddhist texts coupled with music from North America, Central America, Africa, Asia, and the Middle East.
