

Rising Juniors – Class of 2011

- Rising Juniors will be allowed to go through the housing process in pairs, triples, and blocks of 2 rooms (4-6 people).
- All students will be assigned lottery numbers that are computer generated. Priority will be given first by highest Block Merit Point Total, then by lowest lottery number. The lowest lottery number drawn for a pair of roommates or block will determine the lottery number used during the selection process.
- Juniors who choose to voluntarily triple will gain some priority in the housing selection process (see schedule below). **Should a member of that voluntary triple leave residency over the summer, the remaining pair and block may be relocated to another residence area to accommodate students with higher priority. Please utilize this preferential option only if all three students are committed to returning and are comfortable living together in a double.**
- **If your block of four has a merit point total less than 44, your block will be unable to enter the housing selection process as a block. Instead, you will need to enter the housing selection process as two separate pairs. If you have a voluntary triple in your block, you must have a group merit point total of at least 55 in order to proceed as a block. If you have two voluntary triples, you must have a group merit point total of at least 66.**
- Students entering the housing selection process as a block must remain in the block until all available space which could accommodate the block has been filled. If space is not available, Residence Life will break down the block and place you by merit point total, then lottery number, in the next appropriate process.
- Juniors may only enter a senior 8 block if the majority (50%) of the students in the block are seniors.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR RISING JUNIORS

Rising Juniors are not be permitted to retain a room in any residence area. All Rising Juniors (pairs and blocks) will automatically be placed in the campus-wide Junior Housing Selection Process.

Junior/Senior Combinations: A rising Junior currently sharing a room with a rising Senior will be able to retain that room or area move only if they are remaining together. The rising Senior will not be allowed to choose another rising Junior in either process. The Junior/Senior combination must be a current situation. If a rising Junior/Senior combination is splitting, the rising Junior loses retention/area move rights and must enter the Housing Selection Process.

Space Issues for Rising Juniors: There is a strong possibility that **approximately 30 Rising Juniors** may not receive a placement during the housing selection process if those students going abroad or those students not planning on returning in the fall select a room. Anyone in this situation is guaranteed housing and will be placed over the summer. Help us solve this issue by encouraging those students not returning in the fall not to go through the housing selection process!

Junior/Sophomore combinations (50% or more Juniors) will be accommodated on a space available basis, and will select their room at the end of the Junior Lottery. Those who do not receive an upper-class placement during the housing selection process may be moved over the summer by Residence Life to upper-class housing if it becomes available and if the College needs flexibility.
